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# Elements of Coastal Community Resilience



## Purpose

- Reach a basic understanding of the community's level of resilience.
- Some questions that you might ask among yourselves include:
  - ◆ What are the demographics of the area?
  - ◆ What hazards are they at risk from?
  - ◆ In addition to the tsunami hazard, are there other potential risks? If so, how often?
  - ◆ Do their livelihoods depend on their natural resources?
  - ◆ What can you say about governance system at this site?



## Field Work Preparation

- Review the information about the community stakeholders that you will meet with:
  - ♦ What might their interests be?
  - ♦ Identify benchmarks to focus on

## Data Collection Template – Sample Questions

### CCR Element - Warning and Evacuation

- Does your community have a tsunami evacuation plan?
  - ♦ Are the community members aware of the plan?
  - ♦ Has the plan ever been exercised?
  - ♦ Is the plan realistic?

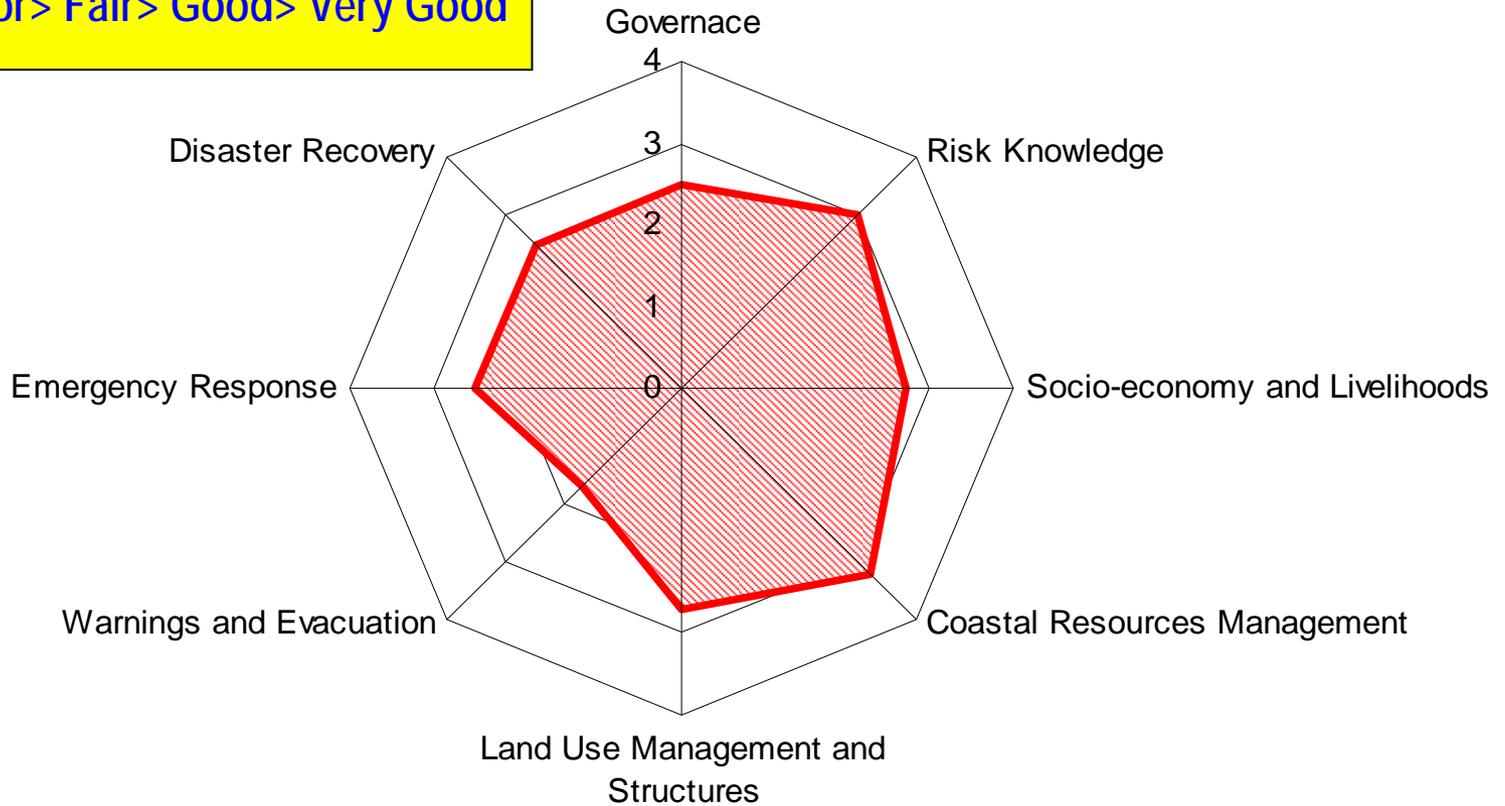
